But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

John 17: 1-11

The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus looked up to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. Christ is among us so that the purposes of all creation might be fulfilled.

We pray for this community: grant us open and patient hearts to walk alongside our neighbors and be always ready to receive you in our midst.

Christ is among us so that we might serve and love one another as God loves us.

We pray for all who are suffering and thirst for wholeness, for victims of physical abuse, and those bearing immeasurable pain. We pray for those in our community, especially (N.): fill us with the power to be a source of comfort and an agent of your healing presence.

Christ is among us so that we might walk in solidarity with all those in pain.

We pray for all who have died, especially for (N.): grant them eternal rest and lovingly comfort those who mourn surrounded with the hope of your promise of life everlasting.

Christ is among us so that the sting of death is overcome.

The Celebrant concludes the prayers with the following Collect:

God of promise and hope, the Alpha and the Omega, we glory in your majesty and give thanks for your son, Jesus Christ, the pioneer of our salvation, who is with us always, one of us, and yet one with you. Look favorably upon us that we might flourish in your life-giving grace and be restored to perfect unity with you and all creation, through him who ascended into heaven and yet remains among us always. *Amen.*


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

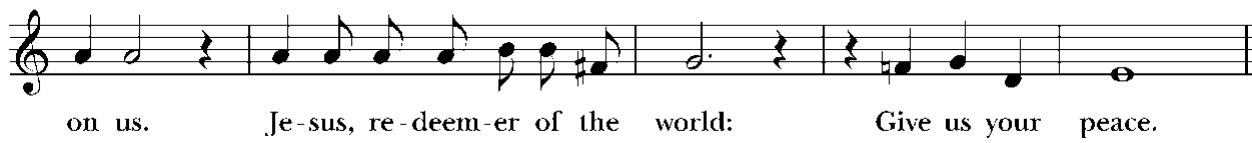
